Question 1) The 2nd Chapter of Mark begins with the story of Jesus healing a paralytic who was dropped down through a hole in the roof. When Jesus tells the man that his "sins are forgiven." What do you think Jesus meant? And, If you were able to choose, would you rather be healed physically of a life-altering ailment or illness, or forgiven your sins? Why?

Question 2) Our reading today challenges us to wrestle with who Jesus is – and who He is calling to follow Him. From these stories, what is the focus of Jesus' ministry – compassion for people or theological correctness? Also, who benefits from what Jesus says? Who loses out?

Question 3) Mark 2:14 says Jesus said to Levi ""Follow me." And he got up and followed him." Based on what you've read so far in Mark, how would you respond to Jesus' invitation/call? Why do you think may people choose not to follow Jesus?
