<u>Session 4: Tues., March 16th</u> Galilee: "The Purpose of Parables" Mark 3:7-4:34 <u>Group Study - 3:</u>

Question 1) Twice in chapter 3 Mark tells a story about the what it means to be a part of the 'called' family of God – when Jesus 'appoints' His 12 disciples, and when describes His 'family' not as those who are blood relations, but are those called or chosen by God. What costs have there been in your life because of your faith – for being a follower of Christ?

Question 2) In the "parable of the sower", Jesus describes four types of soil – the hard soil of the path, the rocky ground with little soil, the soil crowded by thorns, and the good soil that "brought forth grain." Which 'soil' are you? How would describe your faith if you were writing a parable?

Question 3) After He calls His disciples and tells His first parable, Jesus explains the 'purpose' of His use of parables to them saying; "To you has been given the secret of the kingdom of God, but for those outside, everything comes in parables" so that they will not hear and understand "and be forgiven." Why would Jesus purposely confuse His 'followers'? Why is Mark revealing this information to his readers/hearers: is the author trying to provoke us? If so, why?
