<u>Session 6: Tues., March 30<sup>th</sup></u> Galilee: "The Mission of the Twelve" Mark 6:1-29 <u>Group Study - 6:</u>

Question 1) In our reading we read of the people of Nazareth – Jesus' "hometown" – rejecting Jesus and His message: In fact, they thought what He was saying was scandalous; and they couldn't get over it. If you were not a Christian, How would you respond? If you are willing, please share a time when you were rejected (maybe for your faith) – and how did it feel?

Question 2) when Jesus gives the disciples their "mission," He also gave them the "authority over the unclean spirits," and a list of very particular instructions. In many ways this echoes the commission Jesus had given to us: How are you doing on your "mission"? How has the fear of rejection played a part in your living out that mission?

Question 3) Mark has made it clear in his Gospel that repentance is the requirement for salvation; no one can be saved unless they repent – turn away/back – from their sins. This was – and still is – a hard message to live out. What does "repentance" mean to you? Have you ever repented for something – how did it feel? Did the promise of forgiveness make it easier to do?
