<u>Session 8: Tues., April 20th</u> Judea & Samaria: "Jesus Foretells His Death I, II & III" <u>Group Study - 8:</u>

Question 1) Three times in our reading this week, Jesus predicts His own death: He does this to teach us a lesson about what it not only meant to be Him, but also what it means to follow Him. In your faith journey, how have you 'denied yourself' or 'taken up your Cross'? If you feel comfortable in doing so, share with the group when you 'suffered' ('died') as a consequence of your faith.

Question 2) After the Transfiguration, Jesus and the disciples return to Capernaum and is confronted by a frantic, desperate father who begs Jesus to heal his son by crying out, "I believe; help my unbelief." Have you ever been desperate enough to beg Jesus and God for something? Be honest; Did you think anything would happen? Was your "cry," "plea," "prayer" answered? If it wasn't, did this affect your faith?

Question 3) In chapter 10:43 Jesus – in another attempt to settle the on-going debate about discipleship and personal status, power, and rank – tells His disciples that "Whoever wishes to become great among you must be your servant." He goes on to say that the "Son of Man came not to be served but to serve." What words, images, or connotations come to mind when you read the word "servant"? What do you feel about being someone's 'servant'? In what way are you – or have you been – a 'servant' in your faith?
