Leading with Care

Leading with Care is a zero-tolerance, denominational policy for ensuring a climate of safety for children, youth and vulnerable adults across the Presbyterian Church in Canada.

A "Leading with Care" workshop at St. Andrew's is overdue, and arrangements have now been made to correct this. In anticipation of the lifting of COVID restrictions we will be holding two, two-hour, inperson workshops, to be led by David Phillips from the Presbyterian Church in Canada.

We will be offering participants a choice of workshop dates — either Saturday, February 19 or Saturday, February 26, both starting at 10 am, and they will be held in the Great Hall, with socially distanced seating. Attendance is mandatory for all Elders, committee convenors and members, Food Bank volunteers, Sunday School teachers, ushers, the S-EAOM pastoral team, and volunteers. You are included if you do any other volunteer work at St. Andrew's.

You will be contacted and required to register for your preferred date, and further information will be provided in early February.



We are starting Bible Study again. It will begin on Tuesday, March 1 on Zoom, and run until April 5. The study is "Places of

the Passion," and it is based on the Season of Lent.



Love is in the Air

If ever I was to make an investment for one month of the year, it would be in February with a local floral establishment. For with Valentine's this month, it is reported that this is one of the busiest months of the year for florists. Love is in the air.

This got me to thinking of the Great Commandment (see front cover) which consists of the first and second commandments as given by Jesus; indeed, the standard by which Christians are to live out their life and faith.

It also got me to thinking with the emphasis on mental health that has been brought to the fore in this extended COVID time, that the two great commandments have not, and do not have equal emphasis as we seek to live them out day by day.

Let me best illustrate this with the following account. In my study I have hundreds of three and a half by five and a half inch cards on various topics, one of which is on 'love.' Of all the files on 'love,' they are either centered on God's love for us, on our love for God, and our love for others. And of course, that's the way it should be! But sadly, there is not one reference to the third part of the Great Commandment; namely "as you love yourself." This is the unequal emphasis that I find.



We have researched alternatives to credit cards, so we have now also set up the ability to accept **Interac e-Transfers.** Go to your banking website, select Interac e-Transfer, and enter the amount you wish to donate. It is very important that in the message area you indicate your name, envelope number and how you want the donation distributed: i.e. how much to General Funds, Presbyterians' Sharing, PWS&D and Food Bank. If you do not indicate a split your entire donation will go to the general operating fund, and this cannot be changed later. Another very important part is to use the email: treasurer@standrewsbrampton.ca

Also, for those who donate online through our website, you will receive your tax receipt from Canada Helps. It will not be included on your receipt issued by the church.

A year ago our number one prayer request was for a vaccine to end COVID-19, and we gave thanks when this prayer was answered with not just one but several vaccines, and our joyful prayer was for world-wide distribution and immunity for all. As the weeks turned to months it appeared that the pandemic was receding in Canada and the daily numbers of infections, hospitalizations and deaths kept going down until two new variants emerged and we ended the year with our hospital in Brampton closed to new patients and elective surgeries and yet another closure of schools, businesses and restaurants.

We gave thanks for the development of a booster vaccine and the promise of a possible yearly shot. Once again, in an abundance of caution, we reverted to "online" Sunday Services and a renewed set of prayers for an end to this pandemic that has claimed over 5 million lives lost worldwide to date.

Our corporate prayer life was brought into a Canadian focus as historic fires and floods stretched from coast to coast, with British Columbia taking much of our thoughts and prayers to our Lord for relief, and as our Canadian hospital system is in crisis.

As we dig out from our first major snowstorm in a few years, our thoughts and prayers also turn from our inward view to the political unrest in Ukraine and the scary prospect of a Russian invasion and the horror that would bring. No less forgotten are the people of Afghanistan and the terrible plight facing families and children starving to death. With so many issues here at home and in so many parts of our world we continue to spend some time in prayer to ask God to help us find solutions in our weary world.

Food... For Thought

This past Christmas season has been one of generosity for your Food Bank. There have been corporate donors and service clubs who, knowing this was their last chance to donate, were extremely generous. There have also been churches and numerous individuals who were unable to support us with food during the year, and donated their yearly contribution this Christmas.

A couple of examples:

- The Lions Clubs of Brampton and Bramalea recently merged. They ended up with two club houses for one organization so they sold one of them. The money that was realised by the sale was generously shared with four local food banks, and they are also working with the City of Brampton to refurbish one of the parks.
- Four years ago in the spring, Kenaidan Contracting Ltd. – the company which is in charge of the new Bramalea GO Station, called the Food Bank asking if we wanted some bananas. We accepted, and their opinion of the work done for the clients had them ask me to speak at their Christmas luncheon. I told them of the work done by the Food Bank and showed some of the letters of gratitude received from clients, and they responded by collecting over \$4,000. They invited me back for the next two years and each year the donations increased until this final one of over \$20,000 (see photo). This was the generosity of all the companies working on the GO Station project.

With your generosity and support, the Food Bank has transitioned from working with the Regeneration Food Bank to reopening St. Andrew's. This has been a challenge for both the clients and the volunteers, as COVID has forced the Food Bank to be very restricted in how it handles the clients, both vaccinated and unvaccinated, but we never turn anyone away without some food.

The client numbers are nowhere close to those prepandemic but are slowly climbing, and the clients who come are very grateful for the support.
