MESSAGE TO THE CONGREGATION from

**Clerk of Session - Jean Bradshaw
and Past Clerk - Kim Shepherd**

As many of you may have already heard, our Senior Minister, the Rev. Geoff Ross, will be going on medical leave starting Monday, March 14, 2022. Geoff Ross is able to take up to three months according to the Clerk of Presbytery. It is Geoff's plan to return to work on May 16, 2022, however, this date is subject to change and will depend on how Geoff is feeling and the advice of medical doctors.

The COVID pandemic has been especially hard on many ministers within the denomination, with many finding themselves taking medical leaves. This decision was not made lightly by Geoff, and it was through a lot of prayer and conversation with both the Clerk of Session and the Past Clerk of Session that this decision was made. Arrangements have been made for pulpit supply and pastoral care, Rev. Wayne J. Baswick will be leading us in worship during the month of April (including Holy Week) and the first two weeks in May. Session thanks Wayne for his guidance, leadership and pastoral care during these next couple of months. Please feel free to reach out to Rev. Wayne J. Baswick and also our Clerk and Past Clerk of Session with any questions and/or comments, and we will do our best to answer.

Session knows there will be a lot of concern and people wishing to reach out to Geoff, however, we request that for these two months, as Geoff focuses on his own health – prayers are most welcome and most appreciated, but no phone calls or emails, please.



Wayne's World

Fullness from Emptiness

Luke: 24:1a, 2 & 3

Very early on Sunday morning the women went to the tomb...They found the stone rolled away from the entrance to the tomb...so they went in; but they did not find the body of the Lord Jesus. (*Good News Bible*)



When I left one of the congregations I served, one of the ladies did a needlepoint for me that reads as follows – “The best and most beautiful things in the world cannot be seen or even touched. They must be felt with the *heart*.” - Helen Keller.

Things of the heart are those which make life come alive, for if our hearts are not in it, life can be very washed out, as the following suggests – “We marvel at the silence that divides the living and the dead. Yet more apart, Are they all life long, live side by side, yet never heart to heart.” Author Unknown.

The above needlepoint both reminded me and made me sharply aware in future ministry of those who had and would have broken hearts, hardened hearts and empty hearts. It is from these that there are those who do not have their hearts in it, that is in *life* itself.

How then can our hearts be filled in order that we may live the life that God intends for us and indeed have our hearts in it? Please refer to the Gospel verses above as we seek the answer for this. Yes! These verses have the answer to hearts that can be full and truly alive; a life more and better than we ever dreamed of. (John 10:10 'The Message' translation of the Bible.)

And the answer lies in the tomb - the *empty* tomb!



News from the Pews







Purpose of this chart is to show in a graphic form the shortfall of contributions to expenses as of March 22, 2022



Currently general offerings from January 1 to March 22 are down 9% compared with last year with all other donations increased by 50% for the same period. Expenses are also decreased, leaving a comparable YTD deficit. Thank you all for your generosity at this difficult time.

You can contribute by credit card through our website, mail a cheque, do an Interac e-Transfer or go on Pre-Authorized Remittance (PAR).

To process an Interac e-Transfer: Go to your banking website, select Interac e-Transfer, enter the amount you wish to donate and in the message area indicate your name, envelope number and how you want the donation distributed i.e. amount for general funds, Presbyterians' Sharing, PWS&D and Food Bank. If you do not indicate a split your entire donation will go to the general operating fund, **this cannot be changed later. It is vital that you use the email treasurer@standrewsbrampton.ca**

Even though we've had periods of snow the temperature is slowly rising, and we are starting to feel that spring is just around the corner. This is also evident at your Food Bank, as the warmer temperatures are bringing out more clients. We are seeing older clients who have been coming for years, and new clients that have just discovered the Food Bank. Even though regulations regarding masks and vaccinations have eased, the Food Bank is following the guidance of Session and we are only allowing fully vaccinated clients wearing masks into the building.

World politics, gasoline prices and supply chain problems due to COVID are causing problems with the supply of food, and prices are rising because of these factors. This means that many families that were just getting by are now looking to a food bank for support. St. Andrew's Food Bank supplements the foods that are donated with fresh bread, milk, eggs, wieners, fruit and vegetables, in order to provide a balanced diet for the clients.

We are also supporting other food banks in Brampton, Bolton and Orangeville with non-perishable items that we can spare. We expect that the client numbers will rise, and that eventually the Session will allow us to re-open completely. Until that happens, we will continue to serve those in need in the hallway between the Great Hall and the Education Wing.




PRAYER FOR UKRAINE
