# SESSION NEWS The Protocols are changed

At its September meeting, the Session made several changes to the existing COVID Protocols. <u>Effective immediately</u>:

- Masks are no longer mandatory but are recommended.
- We will no longer have to sign in on Sunday mornings.
- Food and drink will be allowed in the Great Hall. Cooking is not allowed in the kitchen (**cook top and ovens are off-limits**). Food may be served to groups that do not exceed half the capacity of the room.
- Sunday morning coffee fellowship will resume shortly.

Also agreed at the meeting was the creation of a small sub-group of Session to deal with and make further recommendations regarding access by our various groups and renters, as well as the required cleaning of the building. These recommendations will be prepared before the October 3<sup>rd</sup> Session meeting.

With these changes Session wants you to know that your safety and health remain its primary concern. It asks those who are attending In-Person/In-Church worship and our various groups and activities to do what *"feels right for you"* when it comes to your safety and health – and to respect and acknowledge that not everyone has the same comfort threshold when it comes to public gatherings just yet. Above all, it hopes that St. Andrew's is to be a *"Mask Friendly Space"* for all to feel safe and at home. As we have been asking since we resumed In-Person/In-Church worship, Session reminds you to not attend in-person worship if you are not feeling well.

While these changes focus on the In-Person/In-Church worship, to those who watch online – or cannot attend in person – the Session is committed to continuing our online services, which will be broadcast live each Sunday at 10:30 a.m. on the St. Andrew's Facebook page.
