Rosemary's Reflections



Christmas memories — waking up early on Christmas day and seeing my stocking pinned to the end of the bed, a doll peeping over the top; hearing Christmas carols thanks to the local Methodists braving the early morning cold; a glass of my mother's home-made blackberry wine (adults only, of course!); dinner at my grandmother's home, the table laden with turkey and plum pudding. And then there was the year I discovered that Santa didn't exist! As per custom we would leave a glass of milk and a cookie for Santa and, miracle of miracles, it would be gone by morning. One year I bit the four corners off the cookie before going to bed — and then found the very same cookie next day in the cookie tin. Hmmm!

As I grew older, my memories of Christmas changed and I came to think more in terms of people – the family gathered round the fire or table, my first Christmas in Canada and the kindness of my new in-laws. And then with the arrival of our children and later our grandchildren (and now the great-grandchildren), things have changed again. Now the focus for me is on our simply being together – who'll be home for Christmas? So much depends on schedules and distance and, in some cases, health. But no matter – it's still Christmas, and as family and friends we come together in person or online or by phone, because, as I have come to appreciate more and more over the years, Christmas is not primarily about presents and food. It's about people.

Stewardship Corner

The Narrative Budget meeting was held via ZOOM and in person in the Church Sanctuary on Sunday, November 20, 2022. Financial statements had been made available to the congregation one week prior to this meeting. There were 42 people (in person and online) who participated in the meeting.

Rev. Geoff Ross opened the meeting with prayer. Jean Bradshaw was appointed to take the Minutes of the meeting. A representative from each committee presented what they hope to achieve with their proposed budget for 2023.

Anna-Marie Dewar, Treasurer, did an amazing job of putting together an easy-to-understand PowerPoint presentation of the Church's financial statements on the sanctuary screens. Anna-Marie described the various sources of revenue for St. Andrew's along with the Church's expenses. She also went over the various ways that you can donate to the Church. Throughout the meeting the congregation had opportunities to ask questions - and they did.

Anna-Marie Dewar moved that the budget be approved as presented, and this was seconded by Molly Harvey. By a show of hands, or vocal agreement from the online congregation, the vote to pass the budget was unanimous.

A special thank you to Anna-Marie for all the time and effort she spent on the information presented. As well, thank you to Peter Shepherd for all of his technology support. Without Peter's support the in-person version and online portion of the meeting would not have been possible.



Purpose of this chart is to show in a graphic form the shortfall of contributions to expenses as of November 21, 2022

Hinkley Total contributions from January 1 to November 21 are <u>down 34%</u>. This decrease is mainly in our other revenue, the prior year included investments and rental income at about \$107,000 compared to \$11,500 currently. Expenses YTD compared to the prior year are down. Thank you all for your generosity.

You can contribute by credit card through our website, mail a cheque, do an Interac e-Transfer or go on Pre-Authorized Remittance (PAR).

To process an Interac e-Transfer: Go to your banking website, select Interac e-Transfer, enter the amount you wish to donate and in the message area indicate your name, envelope number and how you want the donation distributed i.e. amount for general funds, Presbyterians' Sharing, PWS&D and Food Bank. If you do not indicate a split your entire donation will go to the general operating fund, this cannot be changed later. It is vital that you use the email treasurer@standrewsbrampton.ca

We are actively exploring the most efficient way of using the extra rooms in the Education Wing.

This year we will not be hosting a Christmas lunch for the clients. We don't feel that it would be safe for the clients and volunteers, as we would have a very difficult time enforcing appropriate spacing. Instead, we are going to use the money saved to purchase backpacks for adults. We plan on filling the backpacks with Christmas treats of cookies and cakes, canned ham or corned beef along with hats, scarves, mitts, warm socks and Tim Horton's gift cards.

REMEMBRANCE DAY SERVICE

Our Remembrance Day service on November 6 began with a resounding prelude with organ and trumpet. A watercolour painting of poppies by Molly Harvey on the cover of the Order of Service signalled the theme the day. A reading by Rev. Rosemary Doran of the John McCrae poem, *In Flanders Fields* provided a meaningful introduction.



June and Colin Young participated in the Act of Remembrance and Molly Harvey laid the wreath while Lino Varano played the Last Post and Lament.



During his message Rev. Geoff Ross discussed McRae's training as a doctor at McGill University and his Great War service that inspired the writing of the now famous poem. Geoff reminisced about his grandfather, who was Rev. Dr. G. Deane Johnston, a chaplain during World War II and who, in 1967, was Moderator the Presbyterian Church in Canada. Geoff then shared family photos of his grandfather's war time service while he acknowledged the service of chaplains and so many others who stood firm in their faith throughout the war. They held a faith based on the experience of hope.



Lily Rhind's reading of two verses of John Mitchell's reply to "*In Flanders Fields*" concluded the morning worship as we are all "Standing Firm" as poppies grow.
