Rosemary's Reflections



I lost my watch recently. I was in a great tizzy as I looked everywhere for it and was overjoyed to find it safe and sound after a frustrating search. I couldn't wait to give the good news to my husband, who had been helping in the search. It reminds me of the story Jesus once told about the shepherd who lost a single sheep from his flock and rejoiced when he found it. Jesus told the story to make a point with some of the Jewish leaders of his day, who were scornful of the company he kept. He was, after all, known to consort with "sinners", the outcasts of society shunned by "respectable" people. The point of Jesus' story was that "heaven", the Kingdom of God, wasn't just for the holy and pious but had room for everyone who truly wanted to belong, whether they kept all the human-made rules or not.

It made me think about today's society – at least here in the Western world. Often the message is that if you're not white, you don't belong, you don't count. And yet...one of our grandsons is biracial and I love him dearly (as I do all of my grandchildren of course!). The partner of one of our granddaughters is Chinese. Through Justin and his dad, along with Petra and Natalie, the rest of our family has come to know, enjoy and love people of a different race, background or tradition and be enriched because of them.

Or maybe we only have room for people who pray, preach and praise as we do. There's a story told of St. Peter giving a newcomer the guided tour of heaven. One room they pass has a lot of noise coming from it and St. Peter says to the newbie "Don't make a sound as you go past that room. It's full of Presbyterians [or Baptists or Catholics or Anglicans or ... take your pick!] and they think they're the only people here!"

Enough said? We are now in the season of Lent. Lent is the time leading up to Easter when Christians reflect on Jesus' sacrificial life and saving love. The kingdom he speaks of has room for everyone, regardless of race, colour, age, gender or status, who lives by two simple principles – love of God and love of neighbour. And there is room for all such – even you and me!

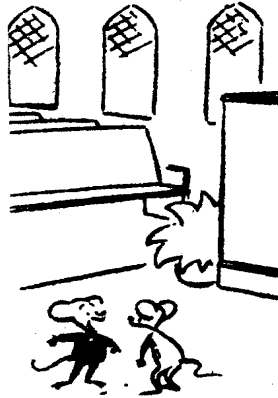

yours now and forever,*

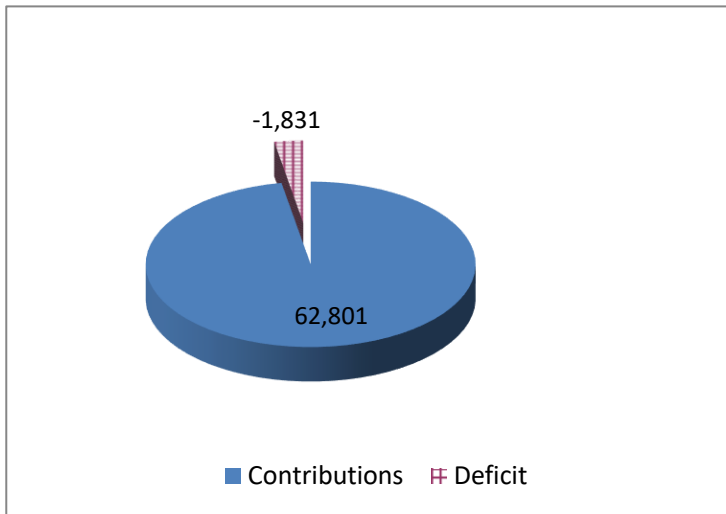

Purpose of this chart is to show in a graphic form the shortfall of contributions to expenses as of February 22, 2023



Stewardship would like to ask everyone to consider going on PAR or increasing their PAR givings.

Included in other revenue is \$30,000 for the SEAOM Grant from the PCC, without this in revenue we would have a deficit of (\$31,831).

You can contribute by credit card through our website, mail a cheque, do an Interac e-Transfer or go on Pre-Authorized Remittance (PAR).

To process an Interac e-Transfer: Go to your banking website, select Interac e-Transfer, enter the amount you wish to donate and in the message area indicate your name, envelope number and how you want the donation distributed i.e. amount for general funds, Presbyterians' Sharing, PWS&D and Food Bank. If you do not indicate a split your entire donation will go to the general operating fund, **this cannot be changed later. It is vital that you use the email treasurer@standrewsbrampton.ca**

The St. Andrew's Pringle WMS met by Zoom on February 7.

The meeting was opened with a meditation based on 1 John 4 v 7-8, and a prayer.

The meeting focused on Love. Participants were asked to suggest names of hymns with the word "Love" in them, and these included Love Divine, Amazing Love, Reckless Love, Jesus Loves Me, This I know, The Love of God, To God Be The Glory, I Love to Tell the Story, Love Lifted Me, Love Came Down at Christmas, The King of Love my Shepherd is.

Doreen Scott-Dunne provided some interesting facts about St. Valentine who died in 269 or 270 AD on what is now referred to as "Valentine's Day."

Doreen mentioned that Valentine's Day is special for her and her husband Ray, as they met on that day.

There were many "couples" mentioned in the Bible, some of whom were Adam and Eve, Ruth and Boaz, Sarah and Abraham, Samson and Delilah, Mary and Joseph, Jacob and Rachel and Jesus and The Church (which is his bride) and "love" is mentioned between 310 and 550 in verses in the Bible. We also learned that one of our member's granddaughter calls Valentine's Day "Loving Times Day," and that we are celebrating the month of "Loveuary."

President Kim Shepherd shared with us that the World Day of Prayer service will be held on March 3 at St. Mary's Roman Catholic Church from 1 - 3 p.m., and that the church has a large parking lot. Everyone is welcome and encouraged to attend. The program was written by the women of Taiwan.

We discussed the upcoming Faith in Action Mission program, and ways that our group can help.

We were reminded that Valerie Warren continues to collect used stamps for the Leprosy Mission. These are sold to help them financially support their work.

We talked about the members of the WMS whom we have not seen for the last several months and got some updates from those who have seen or spoken with them.

Our meeting closed with the Mizpah benediction, and we enjoyed a social discussion afterwards.

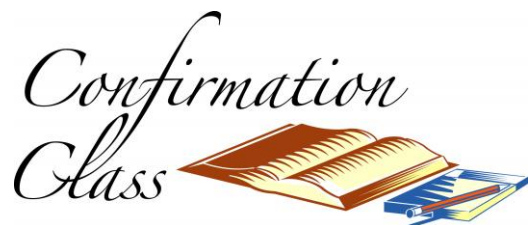
CONGREGATIONAL MEETING

Thank You

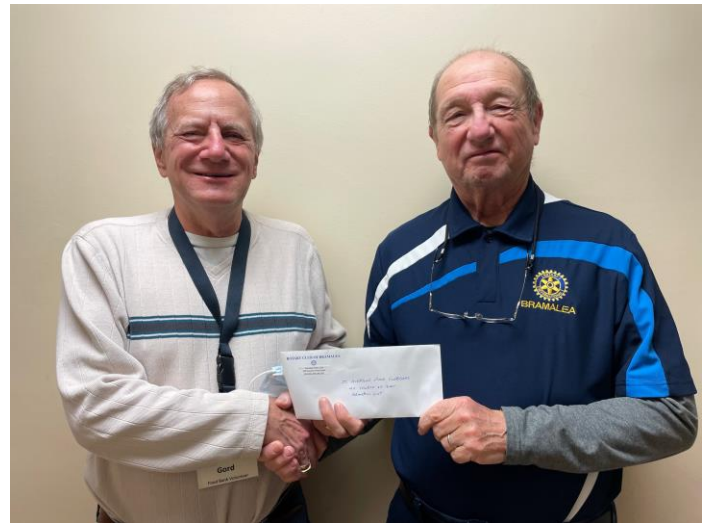

Sandra Jackson, a volunteer member of the Food Bank, realized this and started sending thank you notes to the service clubs, schools, churches and anyone else who assisted the Food Bank. After sending them out we found later that the same recipients would again offer assistance to the Food Bank. This has allowed us to continue to serve the disadvantaged in Brampton.

There are many examples I could relate but I'll only give a few.

A thank you note was sent to the Kenadian construction company for donating 4 boxes of bananas they had left over from an event. They continued to support the Food Bank with large monetary donations at Christmas for the next four years.

Brampton Brick has continued to support the Food Bank for many years, and recently they purchased many cases of Christmas cookies from Bruce Cornish.

Many churches and schools in the area collect food and donate it to the Food Bank (Heart Lake Presbyterian, Emmanuel United, WM. Davis Sr. Public School, etc.) while the service clubs help with funds during the year (Kinsman Club of Brampton, Lions Club of Brampton/Bramalea, Rotary Club of Bramalea, etc.).

“Not fare well, but fare forward....” (T.S. Eliot; “The Four Quartets: The Dry Salvages, III”)

As I write this, I’m preparing for my 10th Lenten journey with you. It’s hard to believe that it’s been ten years already! But that’s what happens when you’re on a journey..., time passes while you’re busy living life; doing what needs doing, getting to know and love people, celebrating the good times and milestones, caring for one another, grieving with and caring for one another in times of sadness and loss. Life is a journey on which we’re changed by the experience – and by the company we share the journey with – and so is ministry!

We are not the same people we were in 2012 – I’m certainly not the same person or minister that I was when I arrived in Brampton from PEI! May God continue to guide and watch over St. Andrew’s and all who serve and attend here.
