

Geoff's Journal

"Do not be afraid..." A Message of Hope.



As you read this, April begins my 10th and last Holy Week with you, and by God's plan, the Easter Sunday Lectionary offers the above message of hope – a direct message of hope to a people and community that was facing an uncertain future. It's a message that I also want to offer to you: "Do not be afraid."

At Christmas, the angels appeared on the night of the Incarnation to proclaim the same message. They told the frightened shepherds that they were bringing a message of "good news of great joy for all the people" - and, at the tomb, the angel's message to the women mourning Jesus' death is also good news of great joy: Jesus "is not here; for He has been raised...." The message of hope in both instances is that the passages of this world – birth and death, beginnings and endings, arriving and leaving - are part of God's plan for us. In 2012 I was called to be your minister because it was God's plan and purpose for both St. Andrew's and me, and now, in 2023, it's now God's plan for me to be called away. I believe that God's plan for St. Andrew's – when I arrived, and continues to be – one of hope: "Do not be afraid."

Easter Sunday will be my 517th and last worship service at St. Andrew's. That number increases to 638 when you include the 25 weddings and 96 funerals I also officiated. (I also did 87 baptisms and welcomed 100 new members.) Over the past 10 years, St. Andrew's has experienced a generational transition: made evident as each year we lost respected, beloved members such as Bob Alexander, Neola McArthur, Bruce Carruthers, Dorothy Brown, Sam Mayes, Bill Russell, John Boyd, and George Burrows.

But St. Andrew's also experienced over 100 baptisms, welcomed 100 new members, and each year started new initiatives like the transition to Term Service, the launch of the GRACE Groups, the establishment of the Flame Memorial Fund, and the start of the South-East Asian Outreach ministry. Throughout all this change God's message was: "Do not be afraid."

On June 24th, 2012, as I preached for the Call, I started my sermon, I spoke about how "my focus [was] on you, on reminding you – each of you, [and St. Andrew's] – of your calling to be a part of the Body of Christ as a people chosen by God as, together, we seek to build up the kingdom of God." And, for my time as your minister, with God's grace and the Holy Spirit's guidance, this is what I did to the best of my ability. As I pray that God will continue to bless St. Andrew's and its people, my prayer for you is one of hope: "Do not be afraid."



ST. ANDREW'S PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH 5TH ANNUAL HANGING BASKET FUNDRAISER

Please note: In the summer of 2022 the hanging baskets did not do as well as they normally do. I contacted the nursery regarding this. They said that in 2022 they tried a new soil method. Apparently, lab tests from the suppliers' lab showed that the soil would act the same as the previous soil. It did not. It dried out faster and wetting was a problem. The nursery has returned to using the previous soil method. The problem should be solved going forward this year.

Please help support St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church by purchasing our beautiful hanging baskets. We are working with the same nursery as last year. The prices have stayed the same as last year. We are offering 10-inch mixed coloured hanging baskets and a 10-inch pot of caliente geraniums in red, lavender or coral/fuchsia. The plant sale commences Sunday, April 2 until Sunday, May 7 – the deadline. Pick up for your order will at the church on Tuesday, May 23. Details of the pick-up times will be provided closer to the date.

Anyone wishing to purchase flowers can do so in two ways.

- The <u>first option</u> is to mail or drop off a cheque or cash, with the order form, to my home at 10 Parkview Place, Brampton, L6W 2G1. I live in the Highway 10/Steeles area the Old Peel Village. Please do not mail cash.
