# MESSAGE TO THE CONGREGATION

from

Clerk of Session - Jean Bradshaw

Here are the procedures for calling a minister:

- 1. Presbytery appoints Interim Moderator.
- 2. Moderator meets with the Session to appoint a Search Committee.
- 3. The Search Committee shall study the goals and needs of the congregation and identify the roles and expectations of both minister and the community.
- 4. The Search Committee will fill in a Congregational Profile with general information about the congregation and the community for prospective candidates
- 5. The Search Committee reports regularly on its progress. The Search Committee will receive profiles from interested candidates.
- 6. The Search Committee reduces the applicants to a shortlist and recommends one name to the Session after extensive interviews, which invites the candidate to come and preach for the call.
- 7. Once the candidate has preached for the call, a congregational meeting will vote on accepting this candidate as their next minister.
- 8. If the congregation decides to issue a call, the task of the Search Committee is completed, and the Session, in conjunction with the Presbytery, will oversee the rest of the process.

This process can take one year to eighteen months.



Starting at 6:30 pm families will be welcome to play some of the games that the organizers will have on hand, or bring their own games to share with others.


This is an "ALL AGES" event, and light refreshments will be served. There will be a sign and a sign-up sheet in the Great Hall in early May.

Stewardship would like to ask everyone to consider going on PAR or increasing their PAR givings.

Included in other revenue is \$30,000 for the SEAOM Grant from the PCC and \$13,249 is from BCCF. During April we have spent \$5,087 on fire panel upgrades which is not reflected in the expenses.

You can contribute by credit card through our website, mail a cheque, do an Interac e-Transfer or go on Pre-Authorized Remittance (PAR).

To process an Interac e-Transfer: Go to your banking website, select Interac e-Transfer, enter the amount you wish to donate and in the message area indicate your name, envelope number and how you want the donation distributed i.e. amount for general funds, Presbyterians' Sharing, PWS&D and Food Bank. If you do not indicate a split your entire donation will go to the general operating fund, this cannot be changed later. It is vital that you use the email treasurer@standrewsbrampton.ca

# **Property Plans**

The Property Committee is working on a number of repairs and improvements to our heritage church building. Here are some updates on two of our high-profile projects.

- 1) **The Fire Panel.** Like many churches, our church building has several fire and smoke detectors throughout the building, all connected to a fire panel – which in turn is connected to an offsite fire monitoring company which operates 24/7. Unfortunately, the panel is now over 20 years old and is obsolete. We have been advised by the monitoring company that they can no longer maintain it or obtain replacement parts. Last year we ordered a new "state-of-the-art" replacement and the Stewardship Committee system, dedicated the anniversary offering to this project. The Food Bank and an outside service club have generously covered the remaining cost. In mid-April we FINALLY confirmed installation dates - April 27 and 28. This implementation should put us in good stead for decades to come. Special thanks to Richard McMechan who was our project lead from start to finish.
- 2) The Kitchen. Many folks have noticed the post-COVID breakdown of two major pieces of equipment in our church kitchen - the coffee machines and the ovens. The coffee machines were removed last month and are being repaired by an associate of Henry Peyer. Replacement parts have been sourced and the current expectation is that they may be back in the kitchen by the end of May. Thanks Henry! The ovens were deemed to be unrepairable, and instead, a three-congregation team from the morning congregation, St. Andrew's the SEAOM congregation, and the Seventh Day Adventists has been assembled to source and install replacement units. Funding is being split between the three congregations so as not to overburden any one group.

# Food... for Thought

# **Best Before Dates and Expiry Dates**

This is similar to a talk I had recently with the Food Bank volunteers and the Food Bank clients.

There is a great deal of confusion about the two, as a lot of people think that they are interchangeable – but they aren't. This confusion is wasting a lot of good food, and with the present-day cost of food it can make a large difference in household income.

# **Expiry Date**

This is used with medications that are usually taken by the patient. The date is set with the knowledge that the medication has lost a certain amount of potency, and the dosage that has been prescribed will still have a specified outcome when taken. After the expiry date passes the strength is unknown and may not be sufficient to have the desired result in the patient.

#### **Best Before Date**

This is a date set by the manufacturer or food processor where they think that the food has reached its peak and will slowly lose some taste. There is nothing wrong with the food just after its expiry date, and it can be consumed with no ill effects. Some dried foods such as pasta, rice, etc. do not have a "best before" date. Generally speaking, one month past the expiry date, if the food has been stored properly, will cause no problems with taste or nutrition. There are always exceptions - especially with dairy products, which should be smelled and tasted before use. Anything that is frozen stops the "best before" date, and if properly wrapped can last a year and still be used.

Store and handle food properly and you will be able to use it, rather than discard it. Your food budget will stretch further because you can now look at the store specials that are close to the "best before" date and be confident that you will be able to use them.

## ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING REPORT

The Annual General Meeting was held on Sunday, April 23, 2023. Forty-one people were in the sanctuary and four were online via Microsoft TEAMS. Stan Loree was nominated to moderate and Jean Bradshaw, Clerk of Session, took the Minutes. Kim Shepherd opened the meeting in prayer.

Minutes of the November 2022 Narrative Budget Meeting were adopted.

Jean Bradshaw commented on the Session Report as printed and later thanked everyone who gave their time, gifts, and financial support to St. Andrew's in 2022.

Jean Bradshaw reported that the **Christian Education** committee is rebuilding Sunday School after the negative effective of COVID and the departure of five teachers.

Two **GRACE** groups are still active.

On behalf of the **Food Bank** Gord Warren stressed that donations from the congregation have dropped dramatically and the need is increasing. The Food Bank's main support is now from outside agencies and other churches.

Colin Young spoke on behalf of **Mission and Outreach**, and he called for volunteers to join the committee. He thanked everyone for their donations of gloves, hats, etc. towards Ellen House and other agencies. The committee is seeking ways to better coordinate and integrate with the SEAOM Ministry. With this in mind, Session is seeking a revision to the Standing Orders to facilitate this action.

Stan Loree spoke on behalf of the **Property Committee**. The big projects were the fire panel and the front steps of the church.

Michelle Tedder of the **Worship** Committee asked for more volunteers for coffee fellowship.

Gord Warren, Henry Peyer, Stan Loree and Debbie Warwick were elected as **Trustees**.

Anna-Marie Dewar, **Treasurer** presented the audited financial statements.

RLB Chartered Professional Accountants were appointed as auditors for the year 2023.

Kim Shepherd and Valerie Martin were approved by Session as Envelope Secretaries for 2023.

Under "New Business" there were questions regarding the rental/occupancy of the manse. Session had approved the rent-free occupancy of the manse by paid clergy. Two motions to reconsider this decision were presented. Both were defeated.

Stan Loree closed the meeting in prayer.
