

Golden Bible Chapters

John Huffman tells the classic story of the man who was in a difficult situation, and in desperation turns to the Bible. He didn't know where to look, so he let the book flop open, and he laid a finger on a verse, which said that Judas "went and hanged himself." After a moment's thought, and not particularly thrilled with this verse, he decided to turn to a different verse for help; he repeated the process, and it read, "Go thou and do likewise." 

Food... for Thought

Now is the time that we are enjoying the bountiful harvest that hard work and God's help has provided us. The Food Bank is lucky that some Brampton community gardens, home gardens and local farms are supplying us with fresh vegetables on a weekly basis. These allow the clients to leave with bags full of vegetables, giving them a balanced diet.

Unfortunately, on the other side of the scale, the Food Bank has lost a store partner which has provided many fruits, vegetables, prepared meals, meat, and dairy products over the years. The store closed and is being converted to another style of store in the grocery chain. We have also been denied pickup of the prepared bags in other stores. The problem is that Toronto food hubs are taking the bags and transporting them to Toronto and allowing a small percentage to be returned to Brampton.

The Food Bank has begun a cost-saving process where we only give out some products on alternate weeks, removed some expensive items from our purchasing list, concentrated on food items, and streamlined our purchasing to find savings. We had to do this, as the expenses were four times what we received in donations. It's a tough time, as the number of clients has risen since last year, as has the expense of purchasing food, while donations are down.

If you know of any school, agency, office or club that would be interested in doing a food drive, please have them contact the church or any Food Bank volunteer, and we will assist with donation pickup.
