

#### **Project Cozy**



#### A Note from the Food Bank


We currently have plenty of empty egg cartons, so no more donations are needed until further notice. Thank you.

## Readings for Sunday, January 14, 2024:

#### Scripture Lesson: Genesis 12:1-9 God's Call to Abram

Now the LORD said to Abram, 'Go from your country and your kindred and your father's house to the land that I will show you. I will make of you a great nation, and I will bless you, and make your name great, so that you will be a blessing. I will bless those who bless you, and the one who curses you I will curse; and in you all the families of the earth shall be blessed.'

So Abram went, as the LORD had told him; and Lot went with him. Abram was seventy-five years old when he departed from Haran. Abram took his wife Sarai and his brother's son Lot, and all the possessions that they had gathered, and the persons whom they had acquired in Haran; and they set forth to go to the land of Canaan. When they had come to the land of Canaan, Abram passed through the land to the place at Shechem, to the oak of Moreh. At that time the Canaanites were in the land. Then the LORD appeared to Abram, and said, 'To your offspring I will give this land.' So he built there an altar to the LORD, who had appeared to him. From there he moved on to the hill country on the east of Bethel, and pitched his tent, with Bethel on the west and Ai on the east; and there he built an altar to the LORD and invoked the name of the LORD. And Abram journeyed on by stages towards the Negeb.

# Responsive Psalm: Psalm 139:1-6, 13-18 God's Complete Knowledge and Care

- R: O LORD, you have searched me and known me.
- C: You know when I sit down and when I rise up; you discern my thoughts from far away.
- R: You search out my path and my lying down, and are acquainted with all my ways.
- C: Even before a word is on my tongue, O LORD, you know it completely.

- R: You hem me in, behind and before, and lay your hand upon me.
- C: Such knowledge is too wonderful for me; it is so high that I cannot attain it.
- R: For it was you who formed my inward parts; you knit me together in my mother's womb.

  I praise you, for I am fearfully and wonderfully made.
- C: Wonderful are your works; that I know very well. My frame was not hidden from you, when I was being made in secret, intricately woven in the depths of the earth.
- R: Your eyes beheld my unformed substance. In your book were written all the days that were formed for me, when none of them as yet existed.
- All: How weighty to me are your thoughts, O God!

  How vast is the sum of them!

  I try to count them—they are more than the sand;

  I come to the end—I am still with you.

Additional Scripture: Hebrews 11:8-10 *The Faith of Abraham* By faith Abraham obeyed when he was called to set out for a place that he was to receive as an inheritance; and he set out, not knowing where he was going. By faith he stayed for a time in the land he had been promised, as in a foreign land, living in tents, as did Isaac and Jacob, who were heirs with him of the same promise. For he looked forward to the city that has foundations, whose architect and builder is God.

#### Additional Scripture: John 8:31-42 Jesus and Abraham

Then Jesus said to the Jews who had believed in him, 'If you continue in my word, you are truly my disciples; and you will know the truth, and the truth will make you free.' They answered him, 'We are descendants of Abraham and have never been slaves to anyone. What do you mean by saying, "You will be made free"?' Jesus answered them, 'Very truly, I tell you, everyone who commits sin is a slave to sin. The

slave does not have a permanent place in the household; the son has a place there for ever. So if the Son makes you free, you will be free indeed. I know that you are descendants of Abraham; yet you look for an opportunity to kill me, because there is no place in you for my word. I declare what I have seen in the Father's presence; as for you, you should do what you have heard from the Father.'

They answered him, 'Abraham is our father.' Jesus said to them, 'If you were Abraham's children, you would be doing what Abraham did, but now you are trying to kill me, a man who has told you the truth that I heard from God. This is not what Abraham did. You are indeed doing what your father does.' They said to him, 'We are not illegitimate children; we have one father, God himself.' Jesus said to them, 'If God were your Father, you would love me, for I came from God and now I am here. I did not come on my own, but he sent me.

# Giving to St. Andrew's

- 1. Give by Interac e-Transfer: We recommend one of two Electronic Giving options. The first is via your bank's website or app: select Interac e-Transfer, use the email <a href="mailto:treasurer@standrewsbrampton.ca">treasurer@standrewsbrampton.ca</a> as the designation for your donation, and enter the amount you wish to donate. It is very important that in the message area, you indicate your name, envelope number and how you want the donation distributed.
- **2. Give Online:** The second online option is via the **Online Donation page** on the church website at <a href="https://standrewsbrampton.ca/donate/">https://standrewsbrampton.ca/donate/</a>. For this donation method, you will receive your tax receipt from Canada Helps, not from the Church. Please print and keep your own receipts.
- **3. Mail It In:** You may **mail** your donation (cheques no cash, please) directly to: Envelope Secretary, St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church, 44 Church St. E., Brampton, ON L6V 1G3. Or, if you wish, you can drop your envelope off in the **mailbox outside the Church Street entrance.** If you choose this option, and have an envelope number, please include it with your cheque.

#### **Search Committee**

This committee is already hard at work. They have profiles to build, job descriptions, and many questions to ask. It will be a few months before the Presbyterian Church in Canada posts the vacancy. Please keep this group in your prayers.

#### Minister's Report

Rev. Wayne will be on vacation from January 15th to January 21st. The pulpit supply for the 21st will be Robert English. Rev. Wayne will have his eye surgery on February 20th; please pray for a successful outcome. He will take two weeks of vacation from February 19th to March 3rd and April 8th to 14th. These vacations are according to the Covenant we have with Rev. Baswick.

#### GoFundMe Campaign

St. Andrew's is a historical building, and repairs are costly. The Session permitted John Collins to start a GoFundMe to raise money for these repairs. When the Fund is ready, we ask that you help promote it on your digital platforms.

# **COMMITTEE REPORTS Stewardship Committee**

Financial Report: The contributions for 2023 were \$393,737.00, and expenses were \$576,872.00. Income received from the Presbyterian Church in Canada was \$10,000.00, and grants from the Brampton-Caledon and the City of Brampton Historical were \$10,000.00 each. The Easter, Anniversary and Christmas offerings were \$36,456.00.

#### **Mission Committee**

Project Cozy means that mitts, gloves, hats and scarves go to our community's unhoused and those in need; collection for these items has started and will run until February 11.

#### Worship and Fellowship

We still need a coordinator for the Refreshment Fellowship; please get in touch with Michelle Tedder to say you will serve.

#### **Property Committee**

Stan Loree reported that work on the eavestroughs is complete. The committee is looking into the cost of replacing the lights in the Great Hall.

#### Food Bank

The Food Bank in 2023 served 70% more clients than in 2022, the most significant increase at the Food Bank in 33 years. Thirty-two volunteers from various churches and groups come in to help every week. Also, there are over 46 donors who donate food to help keep the cupboards open.
