



## Sacrament of Baptism

### Readings for Sunday, May 12, 2024:

1st Scripture Lesson: Matthew 20:20-23

### The Mother of James and John Comes Before Jesus

Then the mother of the sons of Zebedee came to him with her sons, and kneeling before him, she asked a favour of him. And he said to her, 'What do you want?' She said to him, 'Declare that these two sons of mine will sit, one at your right hand and one at your left, in your kingdom.' But Jesus answered, 'You do not know what you are asking. Are you able to drink the cup that I am about to drink?' They said to him, 'We are able.' He said to them, 'You will indeed drink my cup, but to sit at my right hand and at my left, this is not mine to grant, but it is for those for whom it has been prepared by my Father.'

2<sup>nd</sup> Scripture Lesson: 1 Sam 1:21-28 Samuel is Dedicated to the Lord The man Elkanah and all his household went up to offer to the LORD the yearly sacrifice, and to pay his vow. But Hannah did not go up, for she said to her husband, 'As soon as the child is weaned, I will bring him, that he may appear in the presence of the LORD, and remain there for ever; I will offer him as a nazirite for all time.' Her husband Elkanah said to her, 'Do what seems best to you, wait until you have weaned him; only – may the LORD establish his word.' So the woman remained and nursed her son, until she weaned him. When she had weaned him, she took him up with her, along with a three-year-old bull, an ephah of flour, and a skin of wine. She brought him to the house of the LORD at Shiloh; and the child was young. Then they slaughtered the bull, and they brought the child to Eli. And she said, 'Oh, my lord! As you live, my lord, I am the woman who was standing here in your presence, praying to the LORD. For this child I prayed; and the LORD has granted me the petition that I made to him. Therefore I have lent him to the LORD; as long as he lives, he is given to the LORD.' She left him there for the LORD.

# **COMMITTEE REPORTS Stewardship Committee**

Financial Report: The Line of Credit is at \$17,500, and there is \$49,999. The weekly and S-EAOM offerings are down 13% and 14%, respectively, compared to last year. PAR donations are also down. The Easter Offering was \$7,500.

### Worship & Fellowship Committee

Michelle Tedder will be away for July and August, and the coffee fellowship will end on June 30. We can only have lemonade in July and August if there are volunteers to set it up. A signup sheet for summer fellowship volunteers is posted on the bulletin board in the Great Hall.

The Committee is looking into other activities for the Summer.

### **Christian Education**

In addition to the Wednesday evening Bible Study currently in progress, the Tuesday morning Bible Study is back by popular demand! (Both studies are the same series, running for five weeks each.) The theme is PRAYER, and excerpts from the movie "War Room", which deals with the power of prayer, will be shown, followed by a discussion and group questions to answer.
