God said to Elijah, "Go out and stand on the mountain before the Lord, for the Lord is about to pass by. Now there was a great wind, so strong that it was splitting mountains and breaking rocks in pieces before the Lord, but the Lord was not in the wind; and after the wind an earthquake; but the Lord was not in the earthquake; and after the earthquake a fire, but the Lord was not in the fire; and after the fire a sound of sheer silence." - 1 Kings 19:11,12





Food... for Thought

Behind the Scenes

When an image of a food bank is given most people think of people lined up, getting food and leaving. This is an important part of a food bank, but it's not the only thing happening during the Wednesday Food Bank at St. Andrew's.



We have a dedicated group of people (see photo above) who are working behind the scenes to ensure that the picking up of food by our clients runs efficiently. Every Wednesday morning a group gathers in the kitchen to bag the coffee, milk and sugar; cut the egg cartons into halves, bag fried chicken and any vegetables arriving in bulk. If we run into a shortage in the staffing of the front line we can usually call upon one or more of these volunteers.

Another important job is the unpacking, sorting and storage of the items that are donated by grocery stores, from food drives, and other churches or organizations. This can be hectic or slow, depending on the day or even the time. These donations are picked up from the stores on a weekly basis and taken to our Food Bank on Wednesdays for sorting. We are linked to Second Harvest for pickups at two Foodland stores - one in Brampton and one in Caledon. Second Harvest is a method for stores to donate food that is close to "best before" dates that they are unable to sell, and which they donate to food banks rather than throwing it out. We freeze what we can, to allow it to be used past the "best before" date. This all takes volunteers to pick up, load freezers and record the donation to the stores' accounts.



Before the St. Andrew's Food Bank opens, the stations have to be set up and replenished with food. The trucks have to be unloaded, the orders checked, and a new order produced for the following week. Now you understand why it takes over 20 volunteers to operate the Food Bank on Wednesdays. If you would like to see how we do it, or are thinking of volunteering, please let us know so that we can show you around on a future Wednesday.







The L6X/L6Y GRACE group met on Tuesday, May 14, at 1.30 pm, at the home of Ray and Doreen. We celebrated co-leader Sue Haw's birthday together, and enjoyed a real feast.
