

Rosemary's Reflections



An irreverent thought crossed my mind recently. I was thinking about the story of Jesus feeding the five thousand and found myself wondering what they did for a washroom. I mean – all those people in "a lonely place" (as one Gospel puts it), many far from home. Where was McDonald's when you needed it?! Which reminded me of something that happened to me personally when I was with a group of Canadian church people visiting fellow-Christians in China. One chilly November day we pulled up in a town square. Our bus driver shooed us all off the bus and locked it after us. He was on his lunch break and we were in "a lonely place" (so to speak). What to do? Where to go? We needed food and a washroom. But look – what was that? Salvation! Not from heaven but surely (at that moment it seemed) from the next best thing -There were the Golden Arches McDonald's! beckoning to us, promising rescue, comfort and security. Just telling the story makes me laugh.

There is no Bible reference that I know of saying that Jesus ever laughed, but if we believe that he was human like us, he surely must have done. There is a well-known picture of Jesus with his head back, clearly enjoying a good laugh. "Jesus Christ, Liberator" it's called, sometimes known as "The Laughing Jesus." Some Christians are known not to like the picture. It's disrespectful, they say. They feel it belittles Jesus or his holiness and yet surely the whole point of Jesus is that he is not only divine but also human. It's important to remember that.

Rosemary's Reflections continued

Part of Jesus' life-story is his ability to identify with us ordinary people. He weeps over the fate of Jerusalem. He hugs small children. He gets upset at the disciples from time to time. He mixes with socially unacceptable people. He wrestles over what God asks of him – to die on the cross for us.

So Jesus is very human but he is also divine. When we recite the creed, our statement of faith as Christians, we say "I believe in God the Father and in Jesus Christ his only son..." We have a saying "Like father, like son." Maybe in this case we can say "Like son, like father." When we look at Jesus, we see God, we meet God. By the way he lives and relates to people Jesus displays for us God's love, justice, forgiveness, understanding and mercy toward anybody and everybody – not just the favoured few. He shows us how to access those qualities through our belief in him and how to share them with everyone we meet, which is the job God gives us to do. What a privilege! What a challenge!



All are welcome to attend WMS activities: come study, pray, serve, and join in fellowship.

The Women's Missionary Society is a community of Christians whose purpose, in response to the love of God in Jesus Christ, is to encourage one another and all the people of the church to be involved in local and world mission through prayer, study, service, and fellowship.

At our April meeting we heard about making a Meaningful Impact, written by Colleen Wood for the Glad Tidings magazine in 2019. The first part of the reflection says 'I think sometimes, once we finish our formal education, we give a sigh of relief and think great—I am done with the studying, the tests, and the late nights. Yet, as we grow older, we quickly realize we are never done with learning. Acquiring knowledge is a lifelong pursuit.'

It is so true, we get so relieved when we accomplish an achievement, however, we tend to stop, not pushing ourselves to keep gaining knowledge. Could we say the same for our faith? Do we stop learning, studying, praying? In the passage we read from Proverbs we learn that we are to acquire wisdom and apply it. In the second reading from Philippians, we are also told to apply the knowledge that Paul has been giving—to put it into practice.

The paragraph that stands out to me in our study is – 'It is through our study that we continue to learn from God how we are to act— how to put our knowledge into practice. It is only in learning more about how God calls us to act that we can ultimately know God's purpose for our life. When we study our scriptures, we learn what God is asking us to do, so that we can then act upon it.'

Let us never stop acquiring knowledge and putting that knowledge into practice.

Over the past three months the committee has highlighted three ways to give to St. Andrew's in the form of your offering.

The first option: Offering Envelopes. These are assigned to all members; however, an adherent can also request envelopes. 2024 envelopes are still available. The second option: PAR (Pre-Authorized Remittance). This option of giving/tithing is easy on both the church and you, the member. PAR is set up for monthly remittances which are allocated according to the giver's wishes. With PAR the church receives consistent contributions even while members are on vacation – no catch up required.

The third option: E-transfers. This is a convenient way to give to the church, whether it is for your weekly offering, special projects (i.e. eaves), Easter/Anniversary/Christmas offerings and so much more. This eliminates the use of weekly envelopes, yes you still have an envelope number, and there are no banking fees for e-transfers. You can send your donation to: treasurer@standrewsbrampton.ca.

Great Hall Lights

We have received competitive quotes from some local lighting contractors to replace the Great Hall lights, and have selected the winning bid. The new lights will look similar to the existing ones (round fixture, mounted at the ceiling), but will be LEDs. This means they will use a fraction of the power of the current lights and should last for a few decades. We are also taking advantage of a provincial rebate program which will enable us to recoup roughly a third of the installation cost. This work is planned for completion during the summer months.

Parking lot door replacement

It has been noticed for some time that our parking lot door needs replacement. Additionally, as a service to our congregation and visitors, we are supposed to try to make our building accessible to all participants. The Property Committee is planning to meet both of these aims with a new automatic entry door to replace the existing parking lot door. It will have wheelchair height "buttons" on the exterior and interior which will trigger automatic opening, to permit easy access by those folks using wheelchairs, walkers, or other mobility assistance. It will also be set into a steel frame to increase the stability and longevity of the We have been collecting quotes from door. contractors and expect to decide within a month. The cost of this improvement will be completely covered by the Easter offering, thanks to all who generously donated. This work is planned for completion during the summer months.

Heating System

Now that the warmer weather has arrived, we will be shutting down the heating system to save costs through the summer months. Our normal schedule is to shut down about May 1, but we may be able to save a few days this year because of the mild weather.

Food... for Thought

I didn't do an annual report as I felt it was better to report to the congregation and the many volunteers who help the Food Bank to operate. These are the ones who bag the bulk items, open and set up every week, pick up food donations from various stores, speak to service clubs and schools, and give out the food with a smile every week.

The past year has been very eye opening for the Food Bank committee. No matter how much is donated and purchased we seem to be a little short of high-demand items at the end of the day. However, we always have something for the latecomers, so they never go away empty-handed. We always seem to have an abundance from the partner stores that donate through Second Harvest, but it is gone by the end of the day. We have been purchasing more each week, but I believe that due to the rising food costs we have reached our limit.

Thanks to Sandra Jackson, who brought to our attention the following statistics:

From 2022 to 2023 there was an increase of over 43% in the number of clients that we served. In the first three months of this year there has been an additional increase from 2023 of over 25%. This means that the overall totals are the highest in the history of the Food Bank. We managed to do this with an increase in spending of just over 2%. We are very diligent in shopping the sales and buying in bulk, receiving donations through Second Harvest, donation bags from local stores and an abundance of product donated by Foodland on Vodden. We also pay using PCMasterCard and Scene + so that we use the points to purchase more food. This allows us to add to the donations that we receive.
