## Readings for Sunday, September 15, 2024:

**1<sup>st</sup> Scripture Lesson:** Matthew 18:21-35

### *The Parable of the Unforgiving Servant*

Then Peter came and said to him, 'Lord, if another member of the church sins against me, how often should I forgive? As many as seven times?' Jesus said to him, 'Not seven times, but, I tell you, seventy-seven times. For this reason the kingdom of heaven may be compared to a king who wished to settle accounts with his slaves. When he began the reckoning, one who owed him ten thousand talents was brought to him; and, as he could not pay, his lord ordered him to be sold, together with his wife and children and all his possessions, and payment to be made. So the slave fell on his knees before him, saying, "Have patience with me, and I will pay you everything." And out of pity for him, the lord of that slave released him and forgave him the debt. But that same slave, as he went out, came upon one of his fellow-slaves who owed him a hundred denarii; and seizing him by the throat, he said, "Pay what you owe." Then his fellow-slave fell down and pleaded with him, "Have patience with me, and I will pay you." But he refused; then he went and threw him into prison until he should pay the debt. When his fellow-slaves saw what had happened, they were greatly distressed, and they went and reported to their lord all that had taken place. Then his lord summoned him and said to him, "You wicked slave! I forgave you all that debt because you pleaded with me. Should you not have had mercy on your fellow-slave, as I had mercy on you?" And in anger his lord handed him over to be tortured until he should pay his entire debt. So my heavenly Father will also do to every one of you, if you do not forgive your brother or sister from your heart.'

**2<sup>nd</sup> Scripture Lesson:** Leviticus 19:17-18 *No Grudges, No Revenge*

You shall not hate in your heart anyone of your kin; you shall reprove your neighbour, or you will incur guilt yourself. You shall not take vengeance or bear a grudge against any of your people, but you shall love your neighbour as yourself: I am the LORD.

## Responsive Psalm: Psalm 51:1-12 *A Prayer for Forgiveness*

R: Have mercy on me, O God, according to your steadfast love; according to your abundant mercy blot out my transgressions.

C: **Wash me thoroughly from my iniquity, and cleanse me from my sin. For I know my transgressions, and my sin is ever before me.**

R: Against you, you alone, have I sinned, and done what is evil in your sight, so that you are justified in your sentence and blameless when you pass judgement. Indeed, I was born guilty, a sinner when my mother conceived me.

C: **You desire truth in the inward being; therefore teach me wisdom in my secret heart. Purge me with hyssop, and I shall be clean; wash me, and I shall be whiter than snow.**

R: Let me hear joy and gladness; let the bones that you have crushed rejoice. Hide your face from my sins, and blot out all my iniquities. Create in me a clean heart, O God, and put a new and right spirit within me.

*All: Do not cast me away from your presence, and do not take your holy spirit from me. Restore to me the joy of your salvation, and sustain in me a willing spirit.*

Additional Scripture: Colossians 3:12-13

As God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience. Bear with one another and, if anyone has a complaint against another, forgive each other; just as the Lord has forgiven you, so you also must forgive.

After a much-deserved rest and enjoyable summer, the members of Session have returned to work.

**SEARCH COMMITTEE**

The closing date for applications is October 12. The Committee will then start the process of selecting a new minister. Note: This process is lengthy, so do not expect to have a minister until 2025. Pray for the members of the Committee.

**STAINED GLASS WINDOW - VESTRY**

The Session has agreed to re-dedicate the stained glass window in the Vestry, which the Armstrong-Volpe family donated many years ago.

**COMMITTEE REPORTS**

**Stewardship Committee**

Financial Report: The Line of Credit has increased to \$28,500, with an interest rate of 8%. The payables outstanding is \$18,000. The weekly and S-EAOM offerings are down 22% and 34% below budget, respectively.

**Worship & Fellowship Committee**

This Committee needs volunteers as it serves many functions in the Church - Communion, Fellowship, Events, Ushers, special services and more. Please join the Committee; they meet once a month through Teams.

**Food Bank**

The Food Bank has seen a 30% increase in its clientele. The support of the businesses, schools and colleges, as well as members of the Church, help us to provide this service,

**S-EAOM**

Our sisters and brothers from the afternoon service held three events this summer: a picnic, a barbecue, and a Super Special Sunday service, with 150 people attending.

**Property Committee**

The roof is leaking over the Vestry. The cost of repairing this problem is \$10,000.00. Our investments are recovering, and the funds for the repairs will come from the Flame Fund.
