

CONGREGATIONAL MEETING

The Treasurer, A-M Dewar, will present the Budget for the year 2025 on **Sunday, November 24, 2024., at noon.** You will have time to get a bowl of soup, a sandwich, and a slice of cake.

SESSION NEWS

The Session has agreed to reduce the number of Elders on Session from fifteen to nine Elders. This year, five elders will complete their six years of service and be replaced by four.

The Role Clerk will mail out the list of names of the congregation and the ballot for you to vote on.

THE SEARCH COMMITTEE

The Committee is now conducting interviews with prospective applicants for the position of Minister.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Stewardship Committee

Financial Report: The Line of Credit at the end of October is \$18,000 with an interest rate of 7.5%. The payables outstanding are \$17,100.00. The weekly and SEAOM offerings are down 9% from the prior year. The Advent Offering is designated to update the technology.

Worship & Fellowship Committee

The Committee recommends that we serve only gluten-free for Communion. We are changing how we serve Communion; at Advent and Easter, it will be served by distribution, and all other services will be by intinction.

The Food Bank

The staff and volunteers are holding a soup and sandwich fundraiser on **Sunday, November 24**, for a goodwill offering of \$8.00. The General Fund and the Food Bank will each receive 50% of the funds.

The Food Bank gives a small care package to its clients at Christmas. They would like to receive gifts of small toothpaste, deodorants, hair brushes or combs, toothbrushes, socks, and other small toiletries.
