

Rosemary's Reflections



This will be my last "Reflection" for Inside St. Andrew's. Old(er!) age and loss of energy have crept up on me and I have reluctantly decided that it's time to let go. There is a verse from a hymn by William Cowper that says "God moves in a mysterious way his wonders to perform" and I have had personal experience of that. When I look back, I see God's hand at work in my life in many unexpected ways, leading me from a teaching career in N. Ireland to emigration to Canada and on to work in the Presbyterian Church in Canada all I found myself called to across the country. leadership positions at both national and local levels and, most incredible of all, one day in my kitchen I heard God's call to ordained ministry! And it didn't stop there. God's hand continued, and continues, to be at work in my life, taking me to unexpected places and using me in unexpected ways.

When my husband and I retired and moved to Brampton, we joined St. Andrew's and before long I was invited to become part of the Pastoral Care team, which was a wonderful way to get to know people and on occasion be of help to them. We also found ourselves in demand as supply preachers in various churches and enjoyed getting to know the area and its people. As this was going on, I was also invited to co-author a history of the Women's Missionary Society, which tells the story of the Gospel-spreading work of the national church both in Canada and across the world. Life became busy And then, in more recent years, when perforce I became less active, I was invited to write these Reflections, which has been both a challenge and a fulfilling experience.



Fun fact Henry and I <u>plus</u> Kyasha's parents were all married on the exact same date so the 6 of us now share the same wedding anniversary.


Wedding number 2 was on October 5.

Dear Members, Adherents and Friends:

A minister was found to have diabetes and, while under treatment, acted as a hospital chaplain. His popularity in that post led to his retirement from the church, which made him *minister emeritus*. He was then hired by the hospital to be the chaplain. A woman in his former church, misunderstanding the honourary status conferred on him, spread the word: "Poor pastor Johnson – first he had diabetes, and now he has emeritus."

A church member, talking about her minister: "Six days of the week he's invisible, and on the seventh day he's incomprehensible."

As the Interim Moderator of St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church on behalf of the Presbytery of Brampton, I share the following musings:

Sunday Worship Attendance: Often during a vacancy, the attendance at Sunday services declines as many take a 'vacancy sabbatical' and await the coming of the new minister, after which time they return to church services. I'm glad to say that this is not the case here at St. Andrew's, and I commend the congregation for their faithfulness at worship on Sundays and the vibrant fellowship during coffee hour after the service. St. Andrew's is alive and well!

The Dedication of Many: I will not mention names for fear of omitting those who are among the many who give of themselves for the various ministries within the congregation. Again, during a vacancy, many of the congregation's programs and activities slow down or come to a complete halt – again, awaiting the arrival of the new minister. This has not been the case here at St. Andrew's. Because of dedicated leadership of many persons, we have been able to not only maintain but enliven and expand our activities and ministries.

Search Committee: What a privilege to work together with the members who serve on this committee! God has placed exactly the right people to work together in the search for the next minister. They did a great job in putting together the congregational profile for prospective candidates to get a picture of life here at St. Andrew's and in reading and discerning the profiles which ministers have sent to us to consider. We are now in the midst of candidate interviews, and the committee has formulated questions which accurately and compassionately consider the ministerial gifts required for leadership at St. Andrew's. While we can't pin down the arrival date of the next minister, we can assure you that, with the leading and guidance of the Spirit of God, we will remain faithful to the work entrusted to us.



Sincere thanks are due to the many individuals who participated to deliver a very profound and memorable service on Remembrance Sunday.

The Call to Worship was the familiar, poignant poem "In Flanders Fields," written during the First World War by Canadian physician Lieutenant-Colonel John McCrae and read by Kim Shepherd, which set the atmosphere for the solemn and meaningful service.

Ken Jackson, Colin and June Young shared the privilege of reading the Honour Roll, which included names of members of St. Andrew's who served during World War I and World War II and who either gave the ultimate sacrifice or who have passed since their term of duty. It is worth remembering, that from our St. Andrew's family alone, 89 men and women served in the two great world wars; this puts into perspective the enormity of those who answered the call to serve from all across Canada.

Legion Member and long-time St. Andrew's member, Sue Haw, accompanied by Bill Dewar, laid the memorial wreath on the Communion Table. Sue also delivered the Scripture Lesson from Ecclesiastes 3:1-8, which reminds us "There is a time for everything, and a season for every activity under the heavens....a time for war and a time for peace."

Rev. Baswick engaged with the children during their See and Hear time about why it is important to remember those who stepped up to do what was necessary so that we all can today enjoy the freedoms we have here in Canada. In keeping with the thoughts of Ecclesiastes, Rev. Baswick also delivered an on-point sermon "There is a Time for Everything."

The service was greatly enhanced by the music performed by our wonderful organist, Shelagh Tyreman, amazing senior choir and last, but certainly not least, the remarkable talents of trumpet player Lino Varano. The choir's rendition of Let There be Peace on Earth and Lino's participation throughout the service, can only be said to be bone-chilling in the most authentic and meaningful way.

INSIDE ST. ANDREW'S



I became involved with the newsletter when I was appointed to the Communications Committee in the mid-1990s. At that time Bea Embling was responsible for producing the information for the newsletter. The Committee's duties included collating and stapling the pages that the church secretary had typed and printed.

Dick Wright took over from Bea, then he passed the editorial reins on to Stu Royal, who was followed by Molly Harvey. We took on the task of learning to do page layout when computers changed the way we did the job - this in addition to writing, editing and proofreading the stories that we had encouraged people to submit by our deadlines. In January 2006 Elizabeth Giesbrecht joined the editorial team and served as Editor until December 2017 when her family moved out of Brampton. She was a professional editor, so there was no learning curve for her. For many years Elizabeth and I shared the tasks of gathering stories and laying out the pages.

Over the years we established style guides to enable a consistent publication. We moved from photocopied pages to commercially printed pages. For 30 years my responsibility has been collecting the stories for, and editing "News from the Pews."

When Elizabeth moved out of Brampton we were left high and dry, and Rev. Geoff Ross asked his sister Ijeoma (also a professional editor) to put the newsletter together for us, using the standard format and the monthly reports submitted by the various committee chairs which I forwarded to her. I eventually took over the whole production process.

It has been a labour of love and a joy to work with all our committees and groups and our ministers: – senior, associate and interim – who have all contributed to *Inside St. Andrew's*.

The time has now come for me to hand over the responsibility to someone else to continue providing news to the congregation.

STEWARDSHIP CORNER

By the Stewardship Committee

Our Annual Budget meeting was held on Sunday, November 17th, 2024, when our Treasurer presented the proposed 2025 Budget to the congregation. While most of the committees have submitted budgets similar to those in 2024, there are two that have increased – Stewardship & Property.

Stewardship: As the Search Committee continues on its timeline to find a new lead minister, the payroll has been increased, as the new lead minister will be full-time. We are currently paying our Interim Moderator/Stated Supply at 80%.

Property: The Committee proposed an increase in the amount designated for Major Building Maintenance to \$150,000.00. This figure was broken down by Stan Loree, Chair of the Property Committee. The projects are:

Repaint exterior wood trim - \$20,000.00 Install new fence - \$10,000.00 Boiler pipe insulation - \$10,000.00 Manse renovations - \$30,000.00 Eaves repair - east side - \$80,000.00

Stan advised that we would use our investment portfolio to pay for the boiler insulation, manse renovations and eaves repair, should we go ahead with these projects in 2025. The repainting of the exterior wood trim and the installation of the new fence would be from general funds, but if funds are low, we could withdraw the funds from our investments. A congregational meeting will be called to receive approval for the withdrawal.

Session put a motion forward to the congregation that RLB do a Review Engagement for 2024 rather than an Audit, and the motion was passed unanimously. A review engagement can be done and cost less for the church.

Session put a motion forward to reduce the number of session members from 15 to 9. This motion was passed unanimously.

The congregation unanimously voted in favour of the 2025 Proposed Budget and the motion put forward by Session.

We have seen a decrease in our Pre-Authorized Remittances (PAR) over this past year. We thank those of you who contribute through the PAR, a direct debit program that allows people to support their church through an automatic monthly withdrawal from their bank account.

The benefits of PAR are:

- Contributions can continue to be made even if the donor is away on business or vacation.
- Givers do not have to write a cheque or carry cash each week when they come to church.
- The church will receive contributions consistently, helping pay the bills even in months when givers are away.
- It saves time and work for those who count and register the offerings each week.
- Never again will donors have the frustration of getting halfway to church and then remembering that they forgot their offering!

The Stewardship Committee would like to challenge those not on PAR to join. We have set a goal of having \$10,000 in contributions through PAR. When you join PAR this month, you will also receive either a Christmas CD or a St. Andrew's Christmas Ornament. Please speak to Kim Shepherd or Valerie Martin to get signed up – it is so easy.
