Praying for Peace in Gaza



The war in Gaza has left tens of thousands injured or dead and many more people facing severe hunger. Aid efforts are hindered by ongoing challenges, including limited access and mobility, high costs for goods, and challenges in moving them.

PWS&D is responding through ACT Alliance and Canadian Foodgrains Bank. Local partners have established clinics to provide health services. Since the start of the conflict, churches are being used as distribution points to get ready-to-eat meals to people in need. In southern Gaza, where most people have sought refuge, food assistance is being distributed. Psychological support, especially for children, is being provided in refugee camps.

We echo the words shared by the ACT Alliance, "Gaza's urgent need for peace and humanitarian support remains a top priority. Let us unite for justice and access to aid for those suffering."

Join us in praying and advocating for an end to the violence, enabling all to live in safety and dignity.

The New Heaven and the New Earth

Stewardship Committee

Finances: The deficit at the end of November is \$28,000.00. The weekly offering is 12% below budget, compared to 7% below the prior year. The S-EAOM offering is 30% below budget compared to 15% below in 2023. The Canada Post strike is impacting donations.

The Mystery? – Who is coming to dinner?

Where? – January, February and March at participants' homes; in April there is a themed potluck dinner at the church.

When? – Arrive at 6:30 pm. Dinner will be around 7:00 pm with the evening ending around 10:00 pm (depending upon the people involved).
