

The initial idea was a garden where rocks with engraved plates could be placed, but the issue of upkeep was raised as a concern. Other ideas include a wall with memorial bricks/plates, or an object like a synthetic tree with metal leaves engraved with names and dates. The idea is something in the church with which we can memorialize former members of the church who have died, and which will not cost too much for individual members to purchase. 




1st Scripture Lesson: John 16:12-15

The Spirit will guide you into the truth

'I still have many things to say to you, but you cannot bear them now.
