There is so much in store for us. Yes, the future can often be uncertain and scary, but if we can begin to learn how to live without anxiety, as Jesus taught us to, and if we are faithful to God, then God will be faithful to us, and we can be confident that God will help us through even the worst of times.

I truthfully believe that we are at the beginning of a bright new era of worship, faith and Christian service in the world, and here at St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church, Brampton. I would like to invite you to join me in this new era, and to continue being the hands and feet of Jesus in our community, helping our God to make all things new.


Ready to get back together, **L6T/L6P** Grace Group?

Offerings for the month of July for the morning service was \$18,843 and the SEAOM service was \$1,005. Our fixed costs to cover payroll, utilities, property taxes and general maintance is about \$25,000 per month.

Summer of 2025 at our Food Bank was once again the busiest time of the year for us. As the kids are out of school, more families come as they aren't supported by the school meal programs during the summer break. We are thankful for our 4 High School Students assisting us this summer, as they need volunteer hours to graduate. Most donations stop during the summer due to service organizations, schools, and faith communities not meeting during this time period.

We really rely on the brown grocery bags we pickup from local grocery chains, fresh produce donated by Brampton Community Gardens, and Rock Garden Farms. As a registered charity we are members of Second Harvest, Canada's largest food rescue organization. From January 1 to July 30, 2025 we picked up mostly frozen donated food that has provided 34,460 meals, valued at \$185,217.54, and diverted 189,532.5 pounds of greenhouse gases if it had all been sent to the local landfill.

We are so grateful for this donated food; it all gets distributed every Wednesday. This has helped us during the lean summer months to provide enough food for our increased numbers. In order to ensure a balanced diet we also purchase monthly \$5000+ from FoodLand on Vodden.

Thank you to all the St. Andrew's members who support us all year long!
