



## Readings for Sunday, October 5, 2025:

1st Scripture Lesson: Lamentations 3:19-26

Great is your faithfulness

The thought of my affliction and my homelessness is wormwood and gall! My soul continually thinks of it and is bowed down within me. But this I call to mind, and therefore I have hope: The steadfast love of the LORD never ceases, his mercies never come to an end; they are new every morning; great is your faithfulness. 'The LORD is my portion,' says my soul, 'therefore I will hope in him.' The LORD is good to those who wait for him, to the soul that seeks him. It is good that one should wait quietly for the salvation of the LORD.

#### 2<sup>nd</sup> Scripture Lesson: Luke 17:5-10

## Faith the size of a mustard seed

The apostles said to the Lord, 'Increase our faith!' The Lord replied, 'If you had faith the size of a mustard seed, you could say to this mulberry tree, "Be uprooted and planted in the sea", and it would obey you. Who among you would say to your slave who has just come in from ploughing or tending sheep in the field, "Come here at once and take your place at the table"? Would you not rather say to him, "Prepare supper for me, put on your apron and serve me while I eat and drink; later you may eat and drink"? Do you thank the slave for doing what was commanded? So you also, when you have done all that you were ordered to do, say, "We are worthless slaves; we have done only what we ought to have done!"

(The Word of the Lord: *Thanks be to God.*)

#### Responsive Psalm: Psalm 37:1-9 Commit your way to the Lord

- R: Do not fret because of the wicked; do not be envious of wrongdoers, for they will soon fade like the grass, and wither like the green herb.
- C: Trust in the LORD, and do good; so you will live in the land, and enjoy security.

- Take delight in the LORD, and he will give you the desires of your heart.
- R: Commit your way to the LORD; trust in him, and he will act.
- C: He will make your vindication shine like the light, and the justice of your cause like the noonday.
- R: Be still before the LORD, and wait patiently for him; do not fret over those who prosper in their way, over those who carry out evil devices.

  Refrain from anger, and forsake wrath.

  Do not fret—it leads only to evil.
- All: For the wicked shall be cut off, but those who wait for the LORD shall inherit the land.
- \* <u>The Apostles' Creed</u>: Let us confess our faith together in the words of The Apostles' Creed:
  - I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.
  - I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead.

    On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come to judge the living and the dead.
  - I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.
