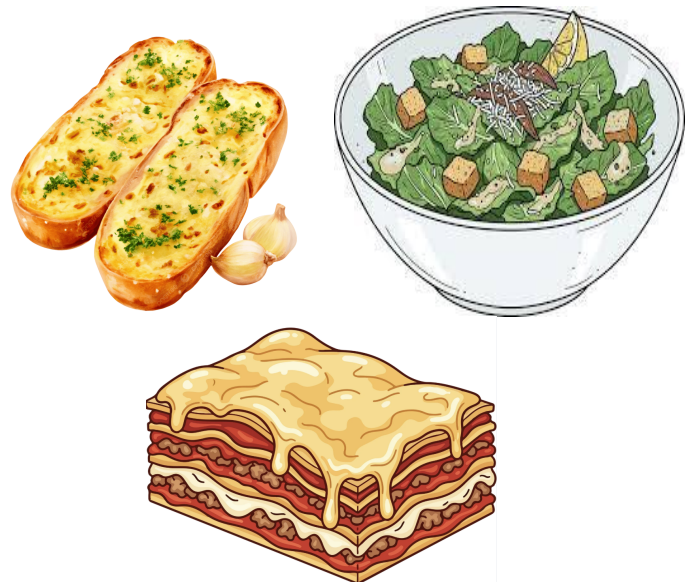

I look forward to seeing you back at St. Andrew’s soon, as we gather together once again as a church family.

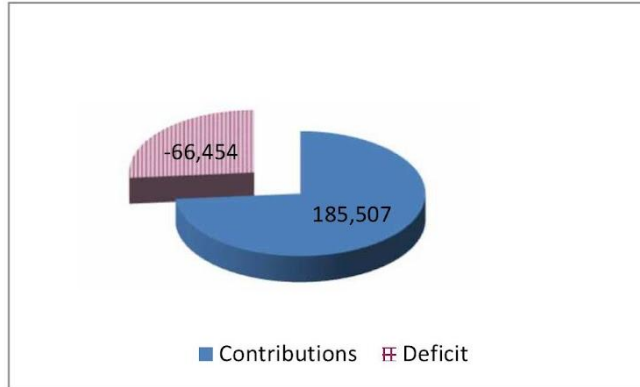

Thank you for your continued support of St Andrews with your generous contributions.

Year to date offerings are down 10% compared to the prior year and offerings in July are down 16%. During the summer offerings drop due to congregants being on vacation . This is why signing up for Pre-Authorized Remittance (PAR) is so important , your contributions can continue even when you are on vacation - the church expenses don't go on vacation during the summer.

The Property Committee had to repair the drain in the parking lot this summer which was not in the budget.

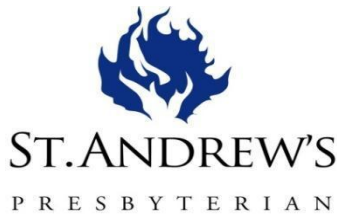
As winter, yes winter, approaches we again ask for the help of the congregation, as we present Project Cozy 2026.

During the summer months when the children are out of school is when we see an increase in our Client numbers. The kids attend with their parents or grandparents; it is great to see the kids actively participating in selecting the food items they would like.

Many Service Groups and Faith Community partners that we rely upon also close down for the summer season so we receive less food and monetary donations. We plan for this shortfall and continue to shop locally for items on sale by reviewing online flyers and using the 'flipp' app.

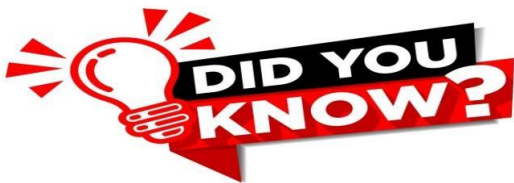

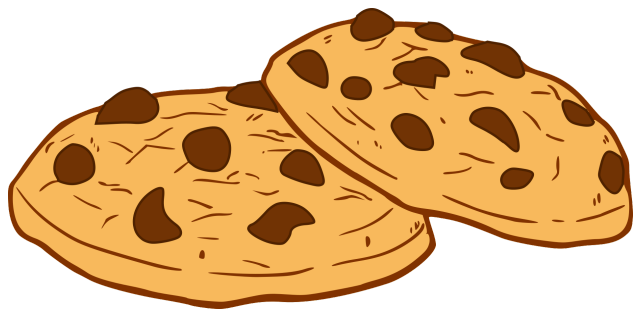

ARGO

What are these small electric buses you see operating in the downtown part of Brampton?

This is a trial bus service, on-demand public transit service that connects downtown riders to the wider Brampton transit services or just delivers folks locally from door to door.

Booking: Riders can request pick-ups and drop-offs using the Argo Transit app. There are no fixed routes. Instead, the vehicles combine trips for folks heading in the same direction. If you don't have a smart phone or computer, call this number: 1-888-401-8252 and give the operator your location and destination.

Boundaries: Downtown Brampton, bounded by Steeles Avenue to the south, Voddan Street to the North, McLaughlin Rd. to the west, and Rutherford Road to the east.

Hours: Monday to Friday from 5.30am to 9.30pm (no service Saturdays, Sundays or Statutory holidays).

Fares: Costs are the same as Brampton Transit fares. Payment has to be made via PRESTO card / cash and paper tickets are not accepted. If you do not have a PRESTO card, you can obtain one at any Brampton Transit Terminal or Shoppers Drug Mart for \$4. You can add funds at any of these locations

with the help of the person serving you. You will need I.D. (drivers licence or Senior Card) to get a Senior designation on your Presto card, as seniors travel free on the ARGO buses. If you want to find out more about PRESTO cards, call 888-401-8252
